The range of services is highlighted by an emerging new cancer care option called [stereotactic radiosurgery \(SRS\)](#), a state-of-the-art treatment delivered noninvasively with the intent to cure the cancer. Although SRS — an advanced form of radiation therapy (RT) — is widely available for treating human cancers, the veterinary field has a limited supply of such advanced technology and services for treating the millions of pets diagnosed with cancer each year.

"This is another step in our commitment to provide comprehensive cancer services and peace of mind to pet owners who will now have a world-class treatment option."

Cancer accounts for nearly 50 percent of all disease-related pet deaths and is the number one cause of death in older dogs and cats. Historically, treating pets with cancer has been limited to surgery, chemotherapy and/or conventional radiation therapy. SRS is a unique addition to those treatment options, providing newfound hope in the fight against cancer for a variety of reasons:

- It is designed to *cure*, rather than merely ease, the symptoms of cancer.
- It is a noninvasive, nonsurgical treatment.
- It is delivered with sub-millimeter precision, maximizing damage to tumorous tissue while minimizing collateral damage to nearby healthy tissue — significantly reducing side effects.
- The unprecedented precision enables treatment in just 1-3 sessions — compared with 15-21 treatment sessions and anesthetic events with conventional RT — leading to decreased risk while optimizing safety, comfort and convenience.
- More types of cancer can be treated, including some forms previously considered "untreatable" based on their delicate locations within the body.

"Lakeshore offers the ideal environment to meet our SRS standards," said [Neal Mauldin](#), DVM, DACVIM (Internal Medicine and Oncology), DACVR (RO), PetCure Oncology's chief medical officer and one of the country's leading veterinary experts in radiation oncology. "By working with these leading veterinary specialists and their outstanding support team with deep expertise in cancer care, surgery and neurology, among others, we are confident that affected pets throughout the region now have a viable opportunity for a much longer and happier life."
